ADVENT DISCIPLESHIP CHALLENGE

Ite Missa Est Presents: Advent Discipleship Challenge Week 3

December 14 is Gaudete Sunday when the vesture of the church flows from violet to rose. Our readings all week are full of gaudete (joy). Isaiah declares that “sorrow and mourning shall flee” (Is 51:11). James asks for patience as “the coming of the Lord is at hand” (Js 35:7). Zephaniah announces the “Day of the LORD” (Zep 3:11). We hear the good news that the messiah will emerge from the tribe of Judah (Gn 49:8-10) while the genealogy of Jesus reveals the whole of salvation history (Mt. 1:1-17). The annunciations to Zechariah, Mary (Lk 1:5-38) and Joseph (Mt 1:20-22) are found here, fulfilling the promise of Isaiah that “a virgin shall conceive .. and you shall name him “Emmanuel” (Is 7:14) The following reflections (by parishioners) offer practical ideas so we might live as people of the “Gaudete,” people of the Advent.

Sunday, December 14 (*Is 34:1-6a, 10; Ps 14:6-10; Mt 11:2-11*)

On this Gaudete Sunday we rejoice that the LORD is near. In our gospel, Jesus himself is a sign that the Kingdom is already in our midst, although we often have to wait patiently for God’s timing, as we hear from James in our second reading (Js 35:7-10). Our joy, then, is not naive optimism, but a deep confidence that God’s renewal is real and ongoing. In that spirit, we are to be instruments of joy — bringing healing, hope, and compassionate service to those most in need. Choose one spiritual or corporal work of mercy that you can perform today or tomorrow, determine specifically how you will carry it out and then execute your plan.

Monday, December 15 (*Num 24:2-7, 15-17a; Ps 25:4-9; Mt 21:23-27*)

Jesus evades the question of the chief priests as to where his authority comes from (Mt 21:23-27). We also hear that the eye of Balaam is true (Nm 24:15-17). The rapid rise of artificial intelligence has brought renewed relevance to the question, “how do we determine what is truth?” How do we see as clearly as Balaam did? How do we learn the way of the LORD? How do we discern where the authority of the LORD is? Is this not the truth we seek? Turn off screens and other distractions for just five minutes so as to be still in the LORD and learn his ways.

Tuesday, December 16 (*Zep 3:1-2, 9-13; Ps 34:2-3, 6-7, 17-19; Mt 21:28-32*)

God challenges us through the prophet Zephaniah: “I will change and purify your lips that you may call upon the name of the LORD” (Zeph 3:9). Lips purified, let us call upon the LORD who desires both our spoken words of faith and our actions of love. In this way we live in hope and faith, since God provides needed grace (if we ask), and we have Jesus as a model. As disciples, our parish motto is “Think like Jesus, Talk like Jesus, Act like Jesus.” Live out your discipleship by sharing a positive word and performing one act of kindness, and pray that the love of Christ will be on your mind and direct all that you think and do.



ADVENT DISCIPLESHIP CHALLENGE

Wednesday, December 17 (*Gen 49:2, 8-10; Ps 72:1-4, 7-8, 17; Mt 1:1-17*)

An avalanche of names cascades through the fourteen generations and are given to us in the opening verses of Matthew's gospel. Tamar, Amminadab, Nahshon, Uzziah and the rest may not be names we are familiar with (Mt 1). However there are those who have passed before us we do know. Parents, grandparents, cousins, aunts, mentors, and guides, who have passed down the faith to us. Today, pray in thanksgiving for the wisdom, guidance and faith that you inherited from prior generations.

Thursday, December 18 (*Jer 23:5-8; Ps 72:1-2, 12-13, 18-19; Mt 1:18-25*)

Jeremiah speaks today of a promised righteous king, a promise fulfilled in the coming of Jesus (Jer 23:5-8). In Matthew we learn of Joseph's trust and obedience to make way for the promised one (Mt 1:18-23). As our Advent journey moves into its last seven days, our readings challenge us to wait in hope, allowing God to work through us just as God did through Joseph's quiet "yes." Today, prepare by practicing the trust and patience of Joseph. In these hectic days before Christmas, look for one way you may offer trust and patience to others, even a small act given out of love will make the coming light of Christ ever brighter.

Friday, December 19 (*Jdg 13:2-7, 24-25a; Ps 71:3-6ab, 16-17; Lk 1:5-25*)

Our Advent scriptures tell miraculous stories of the birth of children. Zechariah and Elizabeth in Luke (Lk 1:5-25), along with Manoah and his wife in the Book of Judges (Jg 13:2-7), probably thought they would never have children. They are like thousands of couples today who struggle to conceive or who suffer a miscarriage. At times like these, God never leaves us and is faithful to Manoah and his wife, faithful to Elizabeth and Zachariah, faithful to couples today. Three times on this last Friday of Advent pray the Hail Mary, especially for couples experiencing infertility, who wait for a child through adoption, and for a family you may know who has suffered a miscarriage or a stillbirth.

Saturday, December 20 (*Is 7:10-14; Ps 24:1-6; Lk 1:26-38*)

We are just days away from Christmas, and today's readings give us reason for hope – God fulfills his promises. In the first reading, the LORD announces to King Ahaz through Isaiah that "the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel" (Is 7:14). Our gospel recounts the fulfillment of this promise in Mary's "yes" to bearing a son who will be the "Son of the Most High, and the LORD God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his Kingdom there will be no end" (Lk 1:32-33). Prayerfully sing or recite the words to O Come, O Come Emmanuel and ask God to prepare your heart to celebrate Jesus' birth on Christmas.
